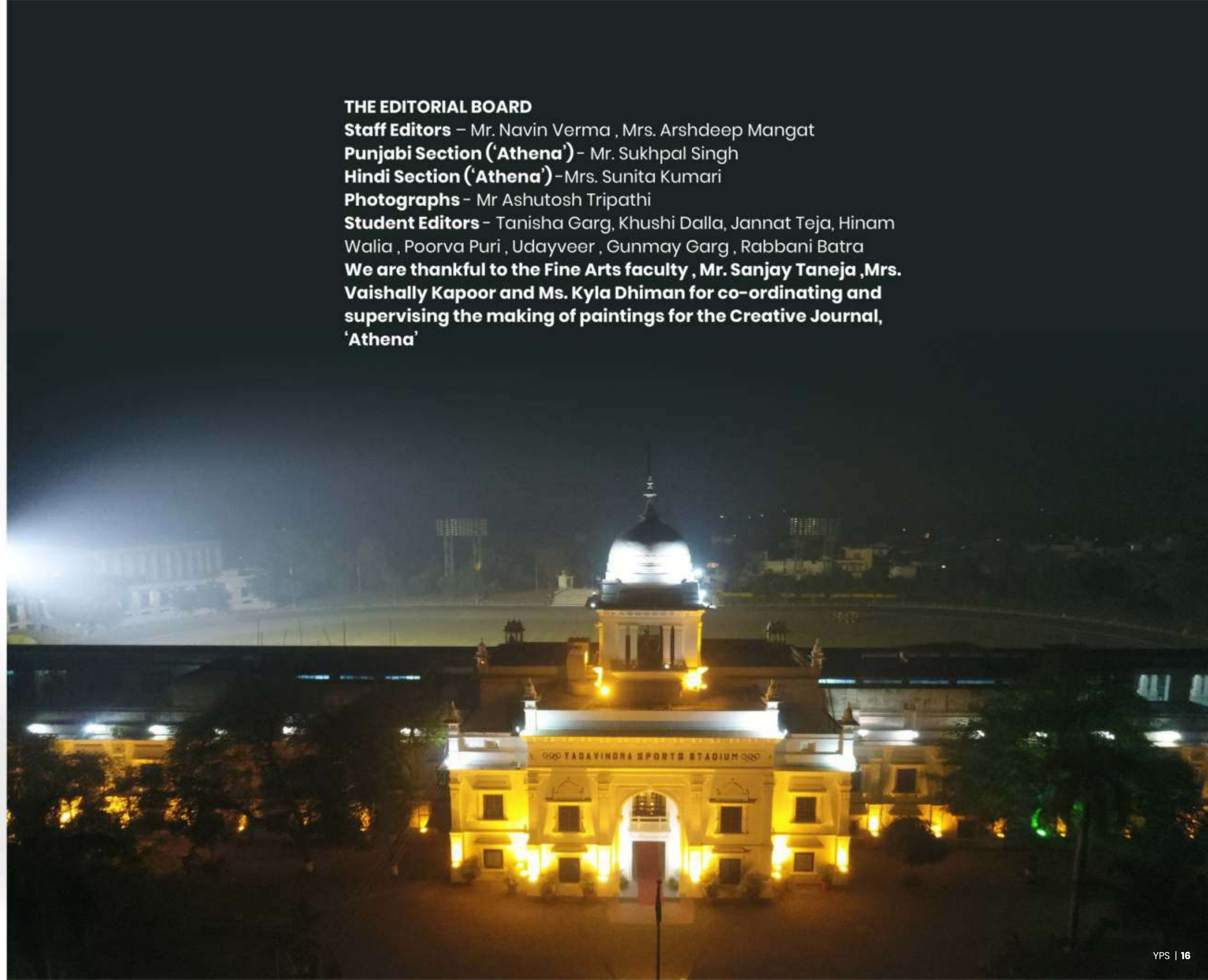

ANNUAL DAY



DIRECTOR'S ADDRESS

(EXCERPTS)

We have just lived through a year of high merits, great successes and big accomplishments, in all spheres. However, during this journey, we did realize our shortcomings, too.

The path of reforms we set out on, three years ago is bearing fruit and helping us achieve our targets. The mandated hours of academic teaching, adoption of the new curriculum prescribed by the council and revision of class time tables have been implemented to achieve a more fair and optimum coverage of the syllabi. The results, we see, are fulfilling and rewarding. Our students are doing well and, perhaps, better than before in all fields... We endeavor to further improve the weak areas and bridge the gap.

YPS boasts of a rich sporting legacy. Our students, blessed with this sporting decorum and coupled with the right guidance and training and their own enthusiasm, have always made a mark in games and sports at all levels. It is pleasing to note that the students continued their winning spree this year too with many of them earning laurels, awards and positions in international tournaments as well as on the national, state and district levels and in inter-school fixtures. With an expansion of our sports resources and the addition of new games and sports, we have been able to enlarge this array and offer more to our students in terms of facilities, training and technical support...

Likewise, the level, extent and range of participation, and consequently the achievements, in the field of co-curricular activities too has risen... I do receive congratulatory messages from my colleagues on the superlative performance of our students particularly their well-behaved demeanor.

These, we will agree, are positive signs that prove that the school is treading in the right direction, imparting the right education and giving the right values to its students, thus, making them more progressive and successful individuals of tomorrow.

I am sure, we all will unanimously agree that education in the last few years, and more so in the last decade, has changed tremendously. With the introduction of digital technology, have emerged smarter methods of teaching and now more knowledge and information is available to the students at the click of a mouse. Education today has become faster, swifter, more communicable and more comprehensible.

Classrooms too are now more vibrant. Lessons are now learnt in a freer and a more democratic environment where the teacher is a facilitator. Discussion, and not diktat, is being made the norm of the classroom teaching. Reform, and not the rule, is the essence of education today. From a sage on the stage to a guide on the side is the new mantra for educators.

In such a scenario, it becomes imperative for us as well to keep pace with the changing times. The new age technology has to be cohesively blended with classroom teaching and brought into our classrooms. We are attempting to combine and merge it into our curriculum at the earliest. Our aim will be to remain in complete consonance with the new National Education Policy.

A new STEM lab has become functional very recently. The lab focuses on experimental learning and enables the students of classes VI-VIII to conduct their own Science experiments...

Another take on technology- I think the moment is now apt to draw the attention of all, to the ill-effects and misuse these new age gadgets and devices can sometimes be subjected to. We, as parents and teachers, need to be wary of such deviations and shield and protect our children from such misappropriations.

In the ongoing session, we have given increased credence to the life skill aspects. From Class I onwards up to Class VIII a structured value education programme run by the global company Round Glass has been introduced for the social and emotional well-being of the students. Class IX and X are being inculcated with enhanced communication skills and etiquette to turn them into more wholesome individuals.

From this year, a major lacunae of a lack of career counseling has been addressed. From Class IX onwards till Class XII, the globally renowned counseling firms viz. Univariety and Eduvelocity have been taken on board. Whereas the former focuses on subjecting the students to a set of psychometric tests to assess their aptitudes, strengths, interests, skills and ability and guide them into suitable professions and careers, the latter facilitates admissions to foreign colleges and universities with scholarships. Eduvelocity has assisted 5 of our students, from the 2019 batch, secure admission in prestigious Colleges in USA and Canada, with scholarship.



THE SENIOR SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT (EXCERPTS)



Beginning with academics, the board results 2019 for classes X and XII were promising and encouraging.

The ISC examination was a 100 % pass result with all the 123 candidates securing a first division . 29 students secured more than 90 % and 58 students more than 80 % marks. Raushni Kaura from the Humanities stream stood first with an unprecedented 99.25%

As many as 20 students secured 100 % marks in different subjects- 5 students secured a centum in Political Science, 2 in History, 3 in Economics, 9 in Physical education and 1 student in Geography .-

In ICSE, 128 students appeared, 25 secured more than 90 % and 45 students secured between 80 to 90 % marks. The first position was bagged by Aryan Duggal with a commendable 95.2% marks . 7 students secured centum – 3 in Computer Applications and 2 students in Economics and Mathematics each.

Though satisfactory, we deem the class X results could have been better. One reason may be of the slightly low performance may be the fact that Science and Mathematics are compulsory subjects now and, sometimes, marginally affect the over-all scores.

One more highlight of the board results this year were the improved school averages. For class XII, the average rose from 83.19 to 84.5 % now, and for class X from 83.11 to 83.67 %....

This year too, the standards in the field of sports remained high with 7 of our students participating in international tournaments and earning medals.

Rajkanwar Singh, a prominent shooter, won 2 gold medals and 1 bronze medal in the Junior World Cup in Shooting held in Germany with world record, 2 gold medals in the 28th Meeting of the Shooting Hopes tournament in Czech Republic and 2 gold medals in the ISSF World

Championship held in South Korea. Sukhdarshan Singh and Abhay Sekhon were also selected for the World Shooting Championship.

Chhavi Kohli, a distinguished fencer, won a bronze medal in the Junior Cadet Commonwealth Championship, England...

Gurshaan Dhaliwal displayed dexterity at the Open Archery Tournament, Malaysia, and along with Jobaninder Singh, at the Macau Indoor Archery Championship held in China. Last, but not the least, Tejveer Sood represented India as goalie at the World Cup Inline Hockey held in Italy.

55 students qualified to play on the national level and 11 of them won medals.

The students who won medals are – Rajkanwar Singh and Abhay Sekhon in shooting, Jobaninder Singh, Jodhbir Singh and Geetanjali Mann in archery, Kunwardeep Singh in taekwondo, Gurnoor Beniwal, Jasnaaz Sidhu and Naunihal Alhuwlaia in shooting, Geetansh Gupta in fencing and Inayat Grewal in squash.

Shikhar Ralhan, a young badminton player, has recently been shortlisted for the Indian Badminton team in the U-14 age group

In team events, school team won the IPSC Hockey tournament for boys U-17 hosted by the school, following which, for the first time in YPS history, they played for the Nehru Cup. Similarly, we were the runners up in the 17th Dhruve Pandove Memorial T-20 cricket Tournament, again hosted by YPS.

Our hockey team emerged winners at the S. Kandhari Memorial Hockey tournament held at Welham Boys School, Dehradun, and the cricket team bagged the second runners-up position at the All India IPSC Cricket tournament for boys U-14 held at Hyderabad Public School, Begumpet.



School athletes performed exceptionally well at the IPSC Athletic Meet held at Punjab Public School, Nabha. YPS stood an over –all third in the boys category from the 13 schools participating with 12 gold, 5 silver and 8 bronze medals. Amtoze Singh was declared the Best Athlete in the U-19 age group from the 160 athletes participating.

During this session, we participated in 24 IPSC sports and co-curricular competitions and won medals...

Last year, a total of 14 treks and 6 adventure camps were conducted to the states of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand in which over 1200 students of classes IV to XII participated. The young adventurers, besides undertaking short and long treks ranging between 5-20 kilometres, carried out activities such as rock climbing, rappelling, crossing the river, Burma bridge and many more.

A mountaineering expedition to an unnamed peak at a height of 5330 meters was completed by a team of 12 students and 1 staff member, during the summer vacation.

A group of 20 students, accompanied by 2 members of the staff, completed a 700 kilometre cycling marathon to the State of Rajasthan...

21 students completed the silver level and 55 the bronze level of the IAYP programme...

Last year, over 120 students attended 9 MUN conferences and almost 55 attended 7 Round Square Conferences, including one at –Ashbury College, Ottawa, Canada...It was a matter of privilege for YPS, Patiala, to get enrolled as a global member of the Round Square body last year.

Back home, YPS hosted the 28th Col Frank Von Goldstein English debate which was a grand affair with 11 schools from all over India taking part...

Over 1200 students took part in five Olympiads –in English, Mathematics, Commerce, Computers and the Green Olympiad. They did well,



especially in the Green Olympiad in which all the 283 participating students qualified and 18 received the Certificates of Merit. Almost 500 students took part in the Humming Bird Spell Bee. 60 students sat for the ASSET Talent Search Examination out of which 35 qualified for the next level, 2 were adjudged the gold scholars and 3 the bronze scholars.

260 students from classes VII-X, for the first time in the school, participated in ANCO, a Chemistry quiz organised by the Royal Australian Chemical Institute...

A number of exchange programmes and study tours were held. A group of 20 students and 2 staff members visited Lycee Clos Maire (Lis Clo Maie) school in France for a class reciprocal programme and another group of 16 students and 2 teachers attended an environment, education and cultural study programme in Japan.

Maheep Malik of class IX and Prajawal Singh of class XI attended short term exchange programmes to Denmark and Hungary, respectively...Harmanjot Singh and Parvaj Singh attended a 2 week long programme in Japan...



THE JUNIOR SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT

(EXCERPTS)

We are proud to share that 287 students from classes I-V walked away with platinum category prizes. Our results in class tests and in quarterly and annual examinations are on the rise.

With the motto, "Learning is fun." During the school hours all students of classes IV and V get to practice Mindspark for 75 minutes in a week ... All students of class IV and V did model making and some interesting science projects on environment, movements of Earth, conservation of resources to name a few. Due emphasis is given on sports. All students of classes I, II and III are allocated a game. 120 students of class IV go for compulsory horse riding class. Our Yadavindrian spirit was evident once again when 576 of us ran the Inter-House Cross Country. 232 students of classes IV and V made memories going uphill as part of the annual trekking schedule. They participated in exciting adventure activities and did long and short treks of 2 to 6 kilometers ... We are proud of the fact that the school keeps us creatively busy and helps us to channelize our energies. This is done through the conduct of multitude of competitions like reading, recitation, just-a-minute, spell bee, Pen-a-slogan, and creative writing. After a stringent selection process 16 to 24 of us from each grade get an opportunity to participate...

At Junior School, the morning assembly is entirely conducted by the students. We walked tall when many of us received merit certificates in the morning assembly for our outstanding performances in the Unified International English Olympiad, the National Talent Search Examination and the Unified Cyber Olympiad at the national level.

The most important function of the Junior School, unarguably, is the Annual entertainment programme. 586 students from the Junior school put up spectacular performances and mesmerized the audience.

The release of the Junior school magazine 'Fledglings' is a much awaited highlight of this show...

A special mention of our school's debut rock band 'Caffeine' in which Asees of V-P and Ineshwar of V-N rocked the show.

And last but not the least, a class on moral values and Yoga every Saturday and hobbies on every alternate day are some other pursuits that go a long way in teaching us life skills and making us better and brighter human beings.

The School celebrated its 72nd Foundation Day on 2nd February.

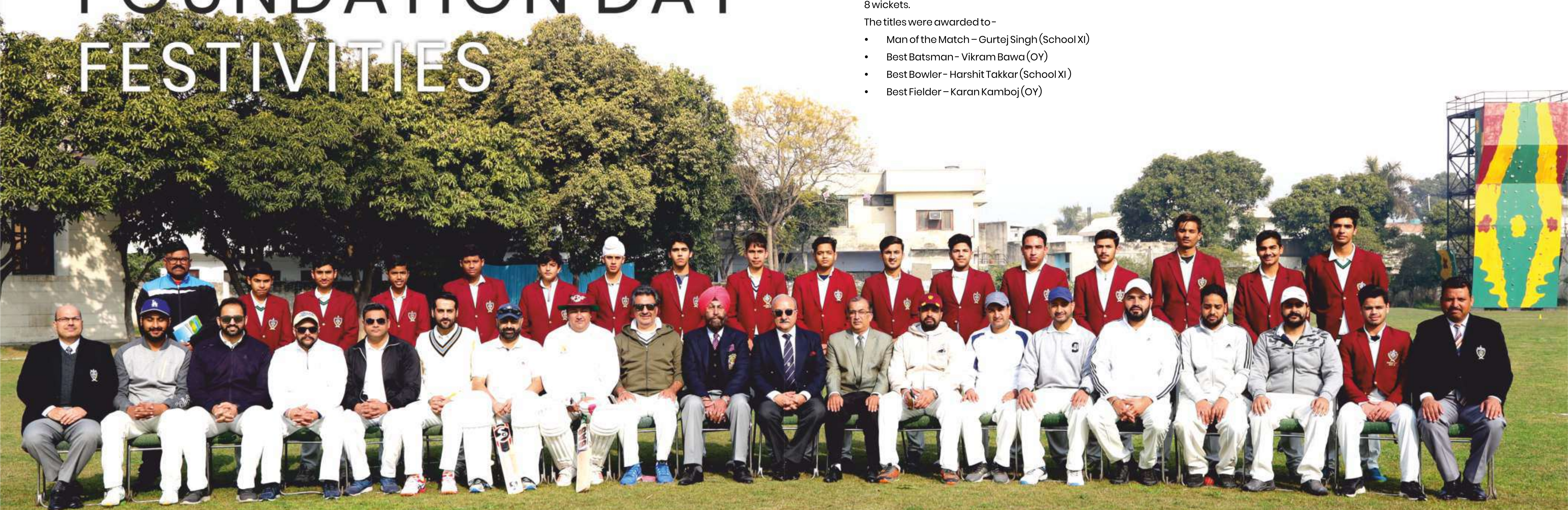

Robotics has been a hobby in our school for the last few years. The hobby is conducted every alternate day along with a month long summer camp which helps us in polishing our skills further.

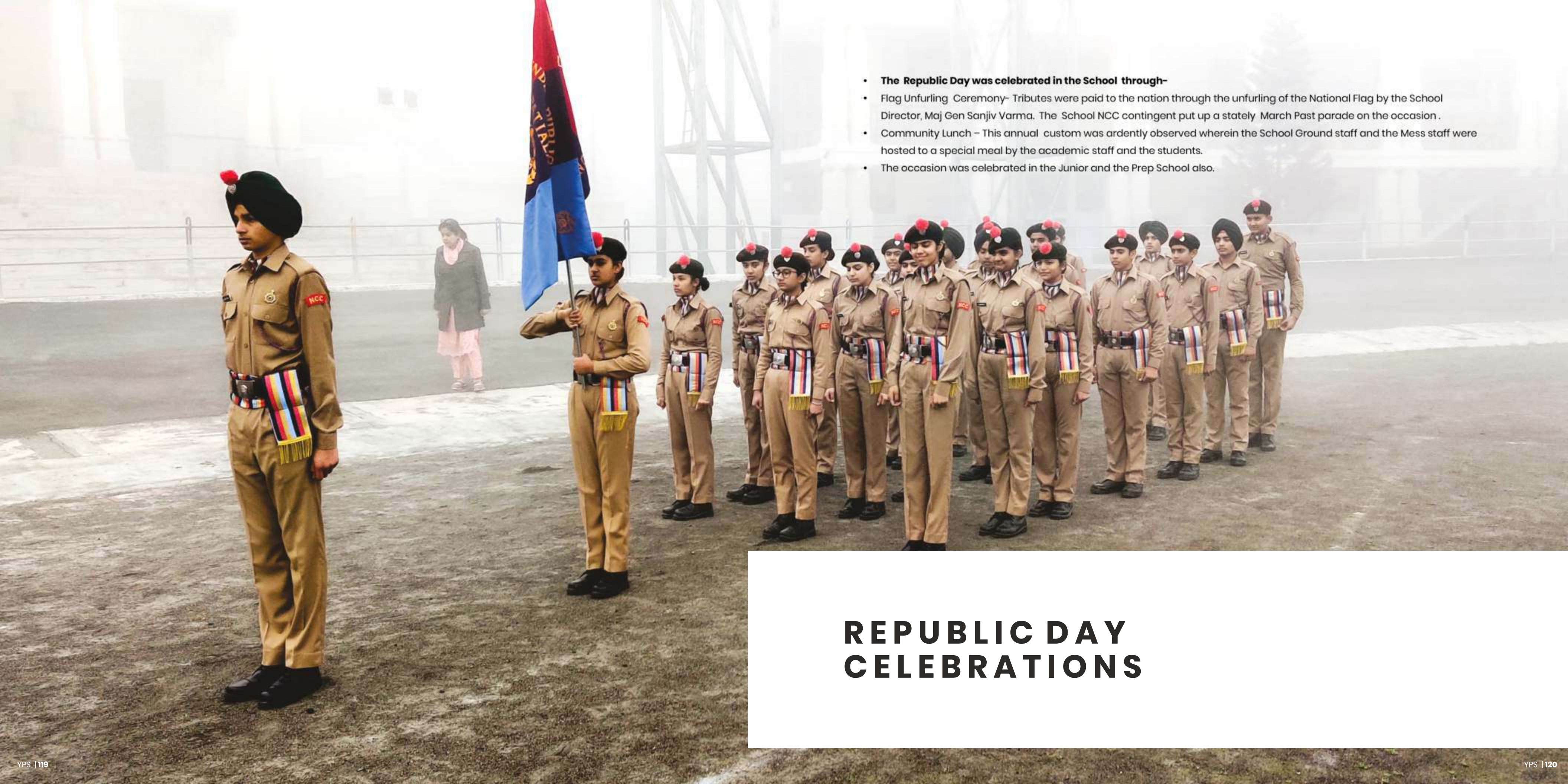


Since I, and many of my fellow mates, have always been intrigued by the new age electronic devices, we were elated to know that the School has introduced this hobby and to be a part of it.

THE FOLLOWING MAJOR WORKSHOPS, SEMINARS AND LECTURES FOR THE STAFF AND STUDENTS WERE HELD DURING THE SESSION -

- **Dr. Madhukar Gupta, IAS**, and an OY of the ICSE 1976 batch ,visited the school to conduct a fruitful interactive session with students on issues relevant to students' life. He also spoke on the importance of critical thinking and being original in life.
- **'Teaching of English Grammar'** -The session attended by the English faculty was conducted by the 'Seed Creative Solutions Pvt. Ltd.
- **'Effective Classroom'** Newer ways of teaching to make the classroom atmosphere more effective and engaging were explored in this session attended by the school staff. .
- **'Workshops on Art Appreciation, Public Speaking and Oratory Skills'** -The sessions conducted by author and storyteller and OY, Ms.Zeeny Jhelumi were attended by school students.
- **Lecture on 'Cancer Awareness'** -The lecture was delivered by Professor Manjit Singh a representative of the Cancer Society, Patiala ,Professor Manjit Singh
- **Representatives from OP Jindal Global University** made a presentation on the courses offered by their institution . The session was attended by the students of classes XI and XII.
- A session on admissions to foreign colleges and universities was conducted for classes IX-XII by resource people from EduVelocity . A separate session was conducted for the parents . Another session on preparation for MUNs was conducted by representatives of the same organisation .
- Skype sessions for classes IX and XI were conducted by counsellors from UniVariety. The sessions centred around discussions on courses /colleges options after school.





EDUVELOCITY AND UNIVARIETY- PROGRAMMES - IN THE TIMES OF LOCKDOWN

THE SCHOOL HAS FOR SOMETIME NOW BEEN AVAILING THE SERVICES OF RENOWNED COUNSELLORS, EDUVELOCITY AND UNIVARIETY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING GUIDANCE TO THE STUDENTS ON VIABLE CAREER CHOICES. THIS YEAR TOO, THE PROGRAMMES CONTINUED AS A LARGE NUMBER OF LIVE AND SKYPE (ONE ON ONE AND COLLECTIVE) SESSIONS BOTH FOR THE STUDENTS AND THE PARENTS WERE REGULARLY CONDUCTED .

- In spite of the lockdown, there has been no downscaling of our Career Counselling programme. The School Counselling team has been closely collaborating with Univariety in updating the students on the opportunities open to them during the lockdown period and beyond through a series of webinars. These webinars cater to the students of classes IX and above and touch upon a wide spectrum of subjects, ranging from Techniques to Improve Focus and Concentration to Details on Universities offering Virtual and Campus Tours. The webinars on Profile Building, Importance of having an Impressive CV and Up Skilling Activities have been appreciated by a large number of students.

Eduvelocity Global Concerns which has already successfully assisted some of our students in reaching the 'Best Fit' colleges has also been reaching out to the students with informative online sessions covering issues such as How to Prepare for SAT and ACT, Scope and Career Outcomes of Different Study Streams and Programs.

Along with this, the one- to- one counselling sessions are also in progress, wherein the students and parents have an

access to the counsellors.

The ISC batch 2020, which has sadly been the most affected during this period of uncertainty ,is regularly counselled and informed of the cancellation / postponement of the entrance exams, extension of deadlines for UG admissions in colleges and universities, both in India and abroad.

To ensure the emotional and psychological well-being of our students, especially the young ones, sessions for Music, Yoga, Art and Aerobics are also in progress. The students are showing promising results and many have participated in online competitions and even won laurels. A large number of students, including the youngest lot participated in the 'Ambassadors of Hope' contest organised by the Government of Punjab.

Simarleen Bajwa, a keen debater of class XII , recently scored the third position in an online debating competition wherein she competed with IAS aspirants and college students.

The students are also encouraged to keep up with their reading habits through digital updates of comics, magazines, classics and modern fiction/non-fiction.

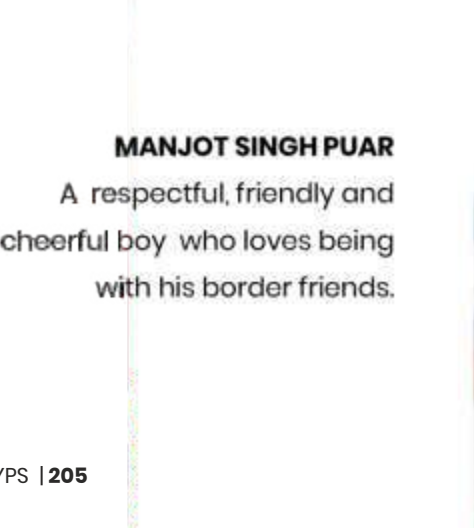
