




# THE HEADMASTER'S MESSAGE

The Chief Guest was Mr. Gerry Arathoon, Chief Executive and Secretary, Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations, Delhi.

The function was held in the newly-constructed Multi-Purpose Hall of the school.

The programme began with the Lighting of the Lamp and the Invocation Song which was followed by the Headmaster's speech, the presenting of the School reports by the School Head Boy and the Head Girl, the Deputy Head Boy and the Deputy Head Girl and the Junior School students. Thereafter, the Chief Guest addressed the audience. The Chief Guest in his speech spoke on the values and other crucial aspects and changes taking place in the field of education. He appealed to the parents and students to spend their most crucial years of Class XI and XII in school and make use of school facilities for overall

development rather than falling prey to the lure of coaching centres. He applauded the school for consistently imparting quality education. He made a special mention on the efforts of the school in honoring its distinguished old students. Finally, he congratulated the prize winners and gave away the prizes.

A colourful Variety Entertainment programme was also presented by school students which included 'Kalbelia', a folk dance of Rajasthan, an endearing performance ,'Fantasy Land', by Prep School children and a mime on Women Empowerment.

The programme concluded with the School Song and the National Anthem.





### THE HEADMASTER'S SPEECH (Excerpts)

Time has the knack of taking us by surprise with its swiftness and speed. As my term draws to an end, one looks back and realizes that it was nine years back in August 2007 that my association with YPS Patiala began ...

Much water, as they say, has flown under the bridge since. I have been fortunate enough to work under the guidance of very wise and able Board of Governors and also worked with my colleagues. A team which has always been forth coming and unhesitatingly followed all programmes which we have jointly envisaged for the school. As a result of which the school has made tremendous progress in all aspects of school development and learning programme...The School is now on the threshold of soaring to greater heights ...

We have just lived through a year of high merits, great successes and big accomplishments. The school this year embarked on a major infrastructural expansion with the coming up of the new residential block hosting Phulkian House and Mohindra House. With its high aesthetic value and functional utility, with air conditioned dormitories and ultra-modern mess and dining facilities, we hope to effectively meet the steadily rising boarding strength of the school and, at the same time, provide the inmates with a more comfortable and home-like stay in the boarding house...

One notable achievement this year was the selection of YPS, Patiala, as the only school from the sub-continent to participate and represent the youth of the country at the prestigious Global Summit on Climate Change, COP21 recently held in Paris in December, 2015... The exercise has catapulted YPS onto the world stage in more real terms and brought a higher degree of credibility and wider fame and recognition to the school.

The school this year also hosted the MUN conference for the first time. This was in keeping with continuously upgrading and exposing our children to various different new programmes and activities prevalent in the best schools of the country...The school also hosted the IPSC IT fest for a second year in a row...

Sports have long been school's forte from its very inception. The school can boast of a rich sporting legacy beginning from its Founder, His Excellency Maharaj Adhiraj Yadavindra Singhji, who, one reminisces, was a great enthusiast, patron and promoter of sports. Our students, have always made a mark in games and sports at all levels This year, three of our students Chhavi Kohli, Ena Arora and Tanishveer Chhada participated in International tournaments such as the Commonwealth Junior Fencing tournament held at Cape Town, South Africa, and more recently at the Asian Fencing Championship held in Saudi Arabia, and won medals .Chhavi at present holds the number 9 rank in fencing across Asia. One of our students, Asees Chhina, is presently a part of the Indian Skeet Shooting team.These students are due to participate at the Fencing and Skeet Shooting World Cup Championships to be held in France and Germany, respectively, later this year. We wish them all the success for these big events...

Apart from this, the school has been consistently doing well in Academics too. Our results have been amongst the best of Council schools of North India. It is a matter of pride for us that some of our toppersfrom Science stream have been among the top 1% candidates across the country...

A freer share and exchange of ideas, thoughts and opinions, whether that be between individuals or institutions, invariably leads to a better understanding and a greater social unity and cultural proximity... This year we hosted teacher assistants from UK, Ms. Georgie Emery and Mr. Jonathan Farningham, who stayed with us for a term and taught creative writing and fine arts to the children. Spanish teacher, Mr. Cezar Tordoya, who hailed from Chile... bid us adieu in November last year. Presently we have Ms. Isabel Saavedra from Chile teaching Spanish to students. Our Spanish programme is now on a strong footing and we are proud that our young children are able to converse in basic Spanish when they pass out from the Junior School. Similarly, under Student Exchange Programme we have had Konstantine Pelz, Anna Grundl and Hanns Kaemmer from Germany studying in grades XI and XII for a year...

Education is, and ought to be,a dynamic concept. The dissemination of education needs to duly evolve and change with time so that it caters to the greater good and needs and requirements of those who receive it. I am sure, we all will unanimously agree that education in the last few years, and more so in the last decade, has tremendously, and miraculously, changed... Classrooms of today are more vibrant, lively and bustling places. Lessons are now learnt in a freer and a more democratic setup where both the teacher and the student are active participants. Discussion, and not diktat, is the norm of the classroom teaching today. Reform, and not the rule, is the essence of education today. In such a scenario, it goes without saying, the influence and interest of all stakeholders in the process of education increases, including that of the parents...I consider myself fortunate to have a parents' body that has always stood by and concurred with the school policies and programmes framed for the good and betterment of the institution and of the child. I wish to thank them for their valuable contribution and participation...

I would also like to avail this opportunity to thank my staff, academic and administrative, without whose support a smooth and seamless running of this school would not be possible...

And, finally, I reserve my deepest gratitude for the Chairman Raja Malvinder Singh and the other revered members of the School Board of Governors who have constantly been pillars of strength and support for us. I can assuredly say that it is largely under their guidance, direction and aegis that the school has prospered and grown to become the great institution it is today. I am perennially indebted to them.

With these words I conclude my speech but not before I share *Albert Einstein's* quote that encapsulates the essence and serenades the spirit of this experience called education-

"Learn from yesterday, live for today, hope for tomorrow. The important thing is not to stop questioning. It is a miracle that curiosity survives formal education".

A major highlight of the show was the Chief Guest presenting a pair of SAM




III missiles and an authentic multi-role latest fighter aircraft Sukhoi SU-30 to the school.







# AN IAYP EXPEDITION


The IAYP trek was a great experience as it provided an opportunity to the students not only to exercise their adventure instincts but also live in the proximity of Mother Nature for a few days.



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# MALAYSIAN MOMENTS A VISIT TO MALAYSIA MALAYSIA



The school team stayed in the country for six days, during which besides participating in the summit, also took out time to go around and watch some landmark places of the city.


The summit, on the whole, was an enlightening experience.

It was a moment of pride for the school as Yadavindra Public School, Patiala, was identified as one of the fourteen leading schools from across the globe to be a part of the COP21, a global summit on Climate Change held in Paris in December, 2015. 
