THE ROOTS OF EDUCATION ARE BITTER, BUT THE FRUIT IS SWEET THE ICSE AND ISC EXAMINATIONS – 2025: RESULTS

Jubilation reigned in the school on percent marks in the ISC Science Wednesday, 30th April, as the eagerly awaited results of the ICSE and ISC examinations – 2025 were declared and the students, once again, proved their mettle in academics and performed exceptionally well in both the examinations, achieving a high pass rate and individual success.

Mallik Arjun Ahluwalia, Head Boy for the academic year 2024-25, has carved a path defined by intellectual depth, social commitment, and remarkable academic achievement with an extraordinary 99.75 percent marks in the ISC Humanities stream, he stands as the national topper.

It is with immense pride that we recognize Divroop Kaur Sandhu, Head Girl of the Class of 2024-25, who stood a close second with 98.75

stream, and Ira Mittal from the Humanities stream, who stood third with 98.25 percent marks. The other high scorers were Mohin Dhiman from the science stream with 97.75 percent marks, Suhani Singla and Anvi Gupta, from the commerce stream, with 96.25 percent and 96 percent marks, respectively.

The entire Class XII batch of 77 students has delivered a commendable performance, achieving a 100% pass rate. Out of these 36 students scored above 90% marks, and 31 students secured over 80% marks.

The ICSE (Class X) students, too, have upheld the proud legacy of academic excellence. With an exceptional score of 99.4 percent marks in the ICSE Board Examinations, Krishiv Bansal stands as the academic topper

of his batch. He secured perfect scores in Science, Mathematics, Computer Applications, Geography, and English Literature.

Rehaan Gupta stood second, scoring an exceptional 99 percent marks in the ICSE Board Examinations, with perfect scores in Science, History, English Literature, and Economic Applications. The third position is shared by Gaatha Mittal, Gursifat Kaur Sekhon and Vriti Sharma, each scoring an outstanding 98.0 percent marks. From a total of 116 students who appeared for the ICSE examination this year, achieving a 100% pass rate, 39 students have scored over 90% marks and 45 students have scored above 80%.
